March is National Women's History Month



National Women's History Month is an annual declared month that highlights the many important contributions of women to events in history and contemporary society. The setting aside of March as National Women's History Month is a fairly new notion however.

In 1980, only 31 years ago, President Jimmy Carter declared the week of March 8th

National Women's History Week, and by 1986, 14 states had already declared March as Women's History Month. This momentum and state-by-state action was used as the rationale needed to lobby Congress to declare the entire month of March as National Women's History Month. And so, March 1987 was declared to be the first official National Women's History Month by the United States Congress. A special Presidential Proclamation is issued every year which honors the extraordinary achievements of American women.

The Green Hills Women's Shelter is proud to take part in celebrating National Women's History Month, and we pay homage to the many brave women who have struggled throughout history to further women's causes and rights.

Famous Female Firsts

1587 - Virginia Dare is the 1st female child born to English settlers on US soil

1849 - Elizabeth Blackwell is the 1st US woman to receive her medical degree

1892 - The 1st female presidential candidate, Victoria Woodhull is nominated

1920 - the 19th Amendment gives women the right to vote

1964 - Haven House, the first "modern" women's shelter in the world, opens in California.

1981 - Sandra Day O'Connor becomes the 1st female supreme court justice

1983 - Dr. Sally Ride becomes the 1st US woman to go into space

2008 - Hillary Clinton becomes the first woman in U.S. history to win a presidential primary

Help Us Bring Alice to the GHWS

The Green Hills Women's Shelter needs your support. The Shelters are actively seeking donations in order to purchase a new client management software called Alice.

Alice is designed specifically for use by domestic violence shelters. The program offers a complete client database and reporting solution for domestic violence and sexual assault agencies. Alice would greatly simplify the task of collecting and reporting data on client demographics and activities that many funders require.

Other agencies have reported how the addition of Alice to their toolbox has helped make the operation of their shelters smoother and has helped them free up valuable time for client interaction that was previously spent doing paperwork.

GHWS is hoping to raise enough funds to purchase the software, licenses for each of the three shelters, and three new computer systems for each shelter to run the program on. Our goal is \$4,000.

Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE)

Developed in 2010 by Missouri Coalition Against Domestic & Sexual Violence, in partnership with the University of Missouri Sinclair School of Nursing and Master of Public Health, the SANE PowerPoint presentation and flyer are intended to help Missouri nursing schools address sexual violence care in the clinical setting by encouraging nursing students to become SANE-certified.

This promotional program, which includes presenter notes, provides MCADSV members with information they can use to promote SANE training as an aspect of nurses' health care education. In addition, this program reinforces the important role nurses can play in service to their communities by increasing informed responses in the healthcare setting to patients who have been or have a history of

being sexually assaulted.
